Secretary's Report

A meeting of the SEBN convened at Mt Airy, NC on May 13, 2017 by President Bryan Bowman, who welcomed Eagle Club members to the joint rally. Guests recognized were Vicky Cates, guest of Secretary Daniels and Vice President Craig Bowen's brother John. Bertha Showman was extended a warm welcome.

President Bowman recognized members that are sick, **Carol Heron** had colon cancer surgery but is now improving, **Syl Bowman** is on a feeding tube but improving. President Bowman asked that we keep them in our thoughts and prayers.

Secretary Daniels reported we have 65 members, comprised of 52 regular members and 13 honorary members. He further reported the

sending out cards to Suzanne Bowman in the loss of her father, to Ray Cox for his recent surgery, to Lila Ashe in the passing of Leroy, and Brenda **Phelan** in the passing of Bill. The club also made a donation to Hospice in Lakeland, FL. In memorial to Bill, and a donation to the American Cancer Society in memorial to Junior Showman. Secretary Daniels reported sending out several dues reminders by e-mail and of the loss of approximately 20 members who have not renewed SEBN dues and / or FMCA dues. Daniels further recognized thanked Linda Karlsson for sending out personalized letters to new members of FMCA in the Southeast US inviting them to join SEBN. He said we received a letter from FMCA of the club's certification and of being in good standing based on documentation submittals. Marty Nixon shared information of a possible up-coming rally at Hilton Head

Island being considered for May, 2018, and **George Showman** shared details for the Fall rally, 2017 to be held at Hoboken, Ga. in conjunction with the annual county wide flea market. He stated the rally will be held on Veteran's Holiday weekend and will have a Veteran's theme. George stated his brother, mother and sister will all be helping him plan and host.

President Bowman shared that the post-New Years rally will be hosted by club officers in Punta Gorda, Fl. This rally will be held the weekend *after* the Arcadia

rally. Also, the club is seeking a host for the 2018 Winter/Valentines rally. President Bowman updated the membership on the 'windshield card' being printed to place on potential member windows as an effort to attract new members and promote the club.

Ed Fisher updated the membership on FMCA's up-coming vote on July 12, 2017 to amend the constitution and by-laws to allow RV families as members rather than restricting membership to those of motor homes only. A majority of present SEBN members voted to support the change in membership requirements. Membership present also discussed the current practice of "Honorary Membership" status. Judy Bukoski explained that upon the death of a member's spouse they are given the option to remain as a full member with voting rights or to select to become an honorary member without voting.

"Mr. Airy is home to a granite quarry that began operation in 1889 and is still productive today. The quarry is seven by four miles wide and around 6,000-8,000' deep. There is enough granite to last hundreds to thousands of years. The recent World War II memorial in Washington, D.C. is made

from this granite. Impressive!

"The first evening of the rally we were treated to **John Mellis's** 'famous sausage fajitas' followed by a few brave souls who entertained us with karaoke. The 2nd day started with a gathering for coffee and doughnuts. We then headed to downtown Mayberry. There are many things in this small town that were the inspiration for the Andy Griffith show. 


